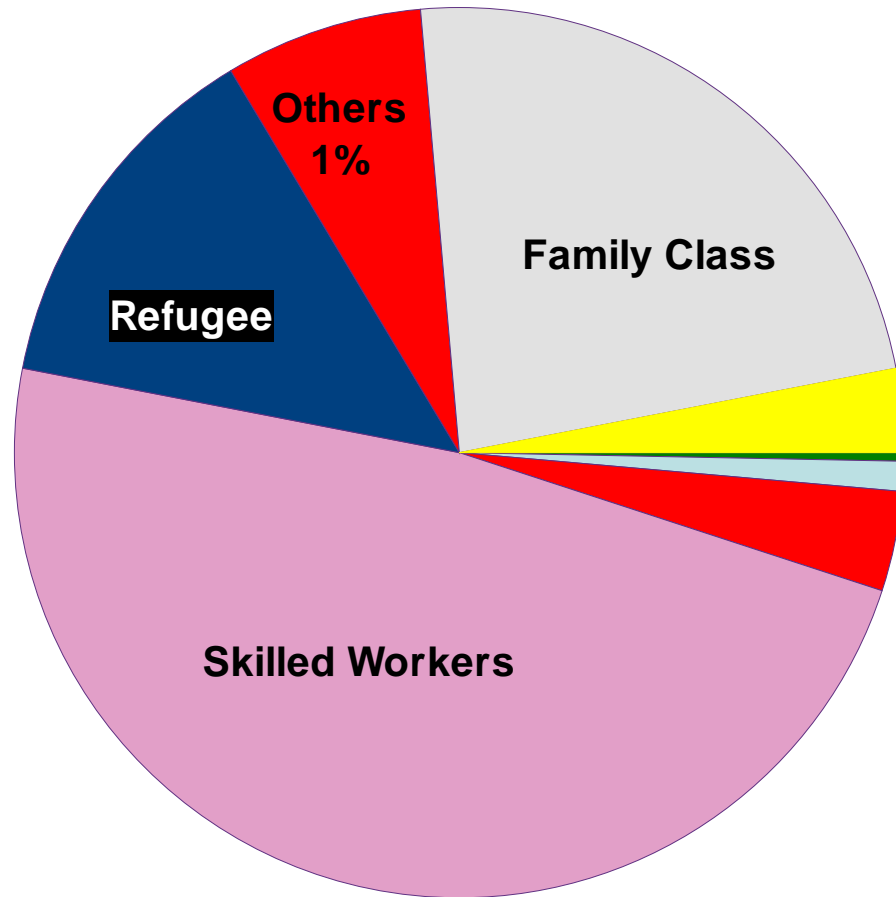

Composition of 262,236 Immigrants who landed in 2005, Canada

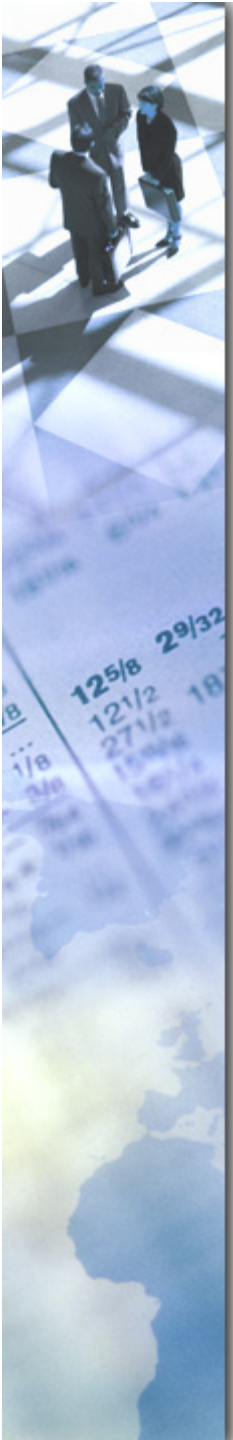

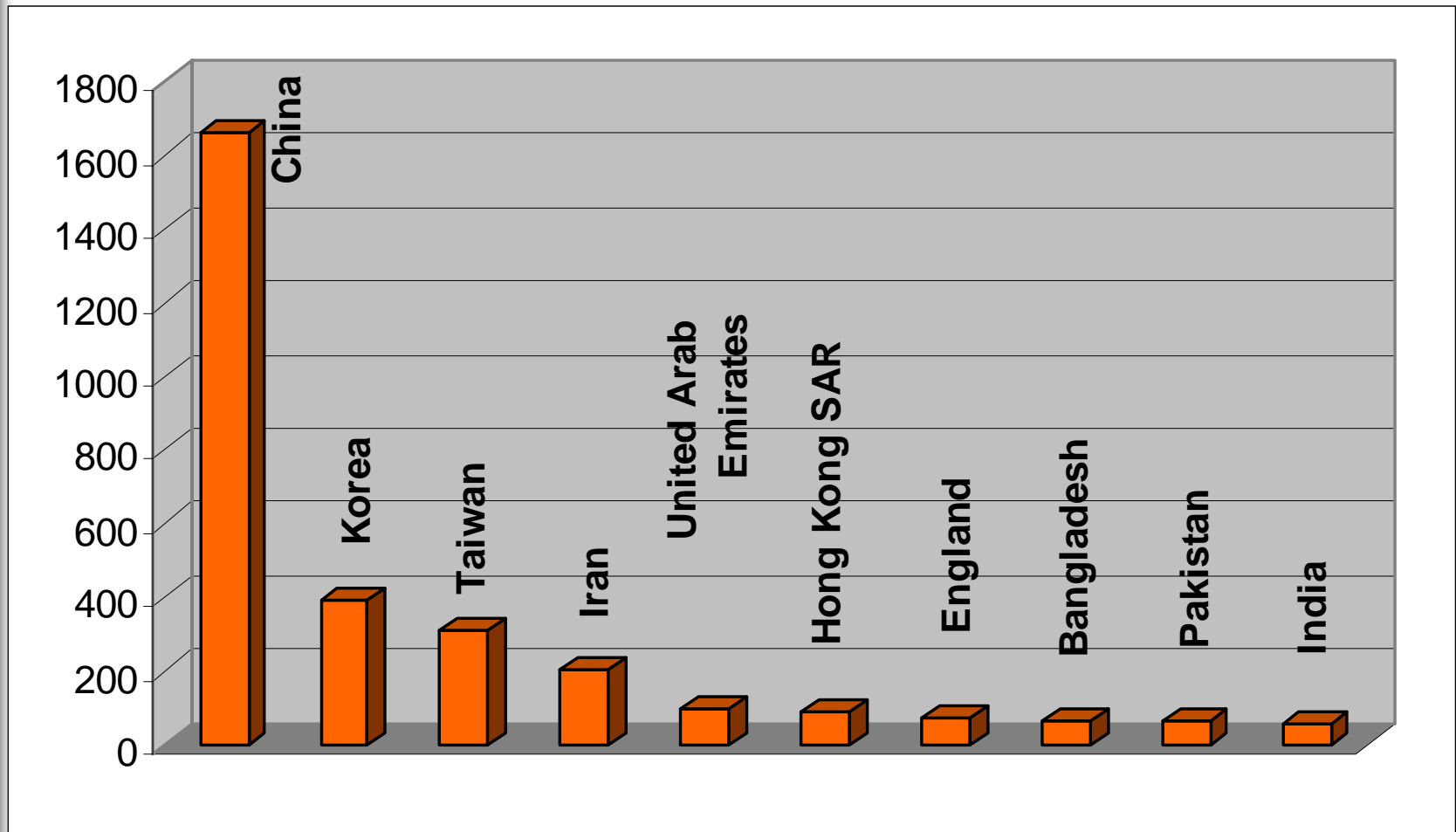

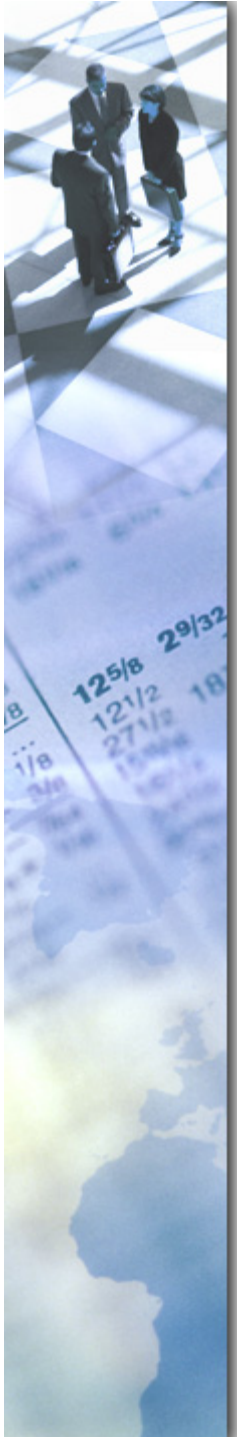

Diverse Mix of Business Immigrants

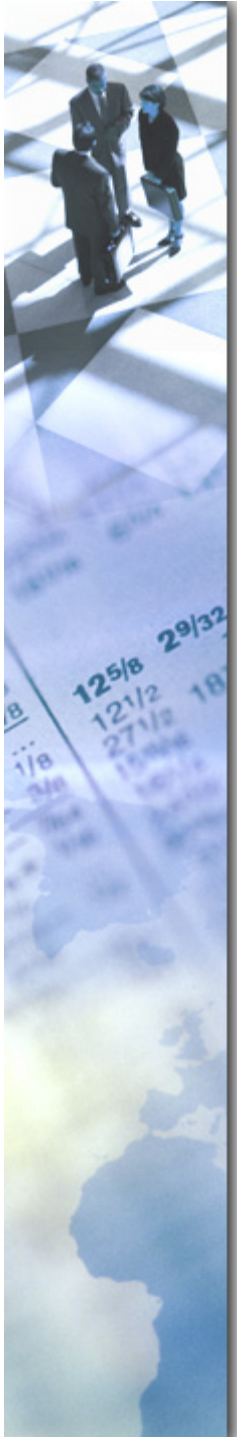
Top Ten Source Countries for Business Immigrants,

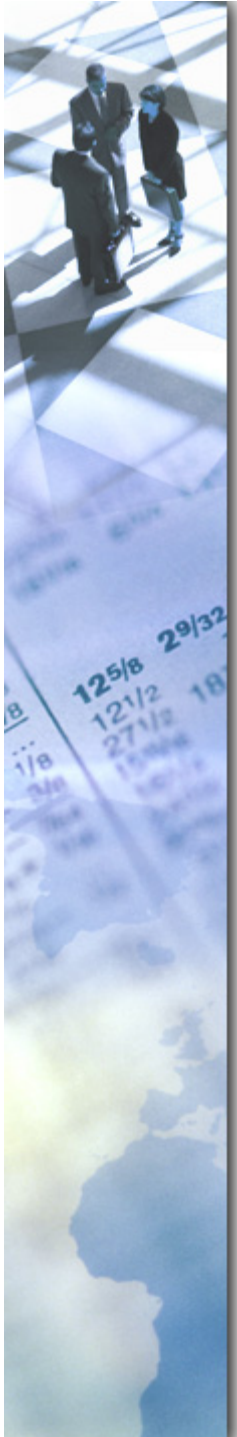
Multinational Investor (MNI)

MNI component of the Provincial Nominee Program

- launched on May 24, 2007
- MNI category is an investment attraction tool - allows companies to nominate 5 key individuals, who are crucial to the company's operations, for work permits and permanent resident visas
- MNI component has 50 nomination spaces available

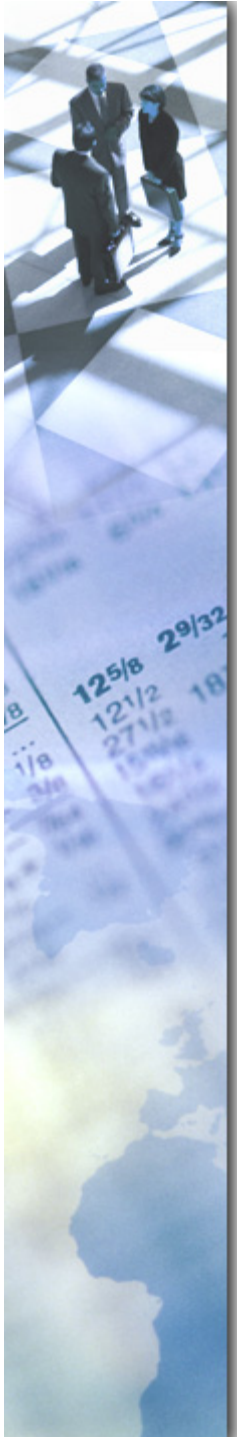
Future Decision

- Expansion of eligibility to include entrepreneurs or SME business development i.e. smaller investments



Multinational Investor Criteria

- **Invest C\$10M or more;**
- **Create 25 net new permanent FT positions**
- **Allows company to nominate up to 5 key employees who meet following objectives:**
 - **Advance training of locals**
 - **Expertise or proprietary knowledge**
 - **Enhance company productivity or competitiveness**
 - **Assist in business development**
 - **Other economic benefits**
